
FROM THE PASTOR

Sisters and brothers,

"For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery." Galatians 5:1

Paul says these words to the church at Galatia, a congregation that is re-implementing elements of Jewish law (including keeping kosher and circumcision). The apostle reminds the errant congregation that Christ set us free for the purpose of freedom and that they should stand fast in that freedom.

For Martin Luther and later reformers, these words were a clarion call. They reminded us that Christ set us free from sin and death. The promise of grace meant a dramatic leveling, for Luther it meant that fellow Christians would be able to read God's word on their own, that sacraments would be open to all, (Continued on page 2)

Domestic Violence Awareness Month



FACTS ABOUT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- An estimated 1.3 million women are victims of physical assault by an intimate partner each year.
- 85% of domestic violence victims are women.
- Females who are 20-24 years of age are at the greatest risk of nonfatal intimate partner violence.
- Most cases of domestic violence are never reported to the police.
- Witnessing violence between one's parents or caretakers is the strongest risk factor of transmitting violent behavior from one generation to the next.
- Boys who witness domestic violence are twice as likely to abuse their own partners and children when they become adults.
- 30% to 60% of perpetrators of intimate partner violence also abuse children in the household.

Signs You Are In An Abusive Relationship

A lot of people do not realize that they are in an abusive relationship. Here are some of the signs that you could be in an abusive relationship that you need to get out of...

- Your partner sexually or physically abuses you. If they ever make you have sex with them when you don't want to, hit you, shove you, or push you, this is domestic abuse.
- Your partner threatens you or your family.
- Your partner puts you down. They attack your capabilities, mental health, looks, or intelligence. They blame you for their violent outbursts.
- Your partner is jealous. They may isolate you from your family or friends or they may accuse you of not being faithful.
- Your partner is possessive. They may check up on you all of the time and they may get angry if you hang out with certain people.
- Your partner has strangled you, beat you, or hit you in the past.

Speak Up If You Think Someone Is Being Abused

If you think that someone (man or woman) that you know is being abused, it is important to speak up. A lot of people worry that it is none of their business, yet you could save a person's life by speaking up. Simply talk to the person in private and let them know that you are concerned. Mention the signs and why it has worried you. Tell them that you will honor their privacy if they open up to you, and tell them that you can help them in any way possible. Often, people in domestic relationships need someone to help them out of the situation, and so one conversation can make all of the difference.

October Outdoor / in person worship schedule

October 11 and 25 at 10:30 in the parking lot Fellowship/Bible study at 9:00 (over zoom)

We will be gathering for worship on those dates at the above worship time.

Why did we choose to move into the parking lot and change our time? For a few reasons. Firstly, during the rainy season our backyard starts to resemble a bog which makes gathering on the lawn less appealing. Moreover, some of our members have trouble walking on rough ground, so we wanted to accommodate them.

We will also have a radio transmitter. What this means is that you will be able to either sit outside and participate in worship or turn the radio on in your car. This is to accommodate folks who are hard of hearing, the possibility of inclement weather etc.

So come to worship on October 11th (and probably 25th as well) in your car. Bring a chair if it is nice weather and sit outside, if it's raining listen to the service on the radio. To confirm: worship will be at 10:30, it will be in the parking lot on October 11th, we will announce the 25th later. Bring your own elements and weather permitting a chair to sit on.

Why aren't we gathering for worship inside? Some of it is logistical – determining the best way to spread out, make sure that we aren't sharing air (we have limited ventilation options in the sanctuary and the fellowship hall has limited space). Also at this point there have been dozens of outbreaks in churches in the United States. Pastor Jimpar Philipson, who led worship for us on September 6th has a brother in law in the ICU in Georgia, probably because of a COVID 19 outbreak in their congregation. We continue to take COVID 19 seriously because it needs to be taken seriously. One of our members had a sister in law die from it, who battled it for months. This is a disease that demands seriousness.

We hope that the pandemic subsides over the coming months and that the council finds it prudent to gather for worship. Until then, we will be gathering in different ways, in different places, on different platforms but proclaiming one LORD, one faith, one baptism.


Congregational Meeting on November 22nd




