

Quilting outdoors has worked so far however, with the Fall winds blowing leaves off the roof unto the quilt frame, the breezes, brief light showers, cooler temperatures, it was a unanimous decision to abandon further attempts to quilt until the decision is made to allow access to use the Fellowship Hall.

We actually completed making 50 quilts this Fall, which was more than we usually do in this time frame. All who participated in making these quilts are appreciated. We will be able to make quilts available for community outreach this Fall, meeting needs at Signs of Victory, House of Zion, Hospice House, Helping Hands (if more are needed), and Jackson Street House.

Disaster Response from FLC The September fires in Linn County were met with a response by members of Faith Lutheran. Thirty full size quilts and four children's quilts were taken to the fairgrounds for distribution. Three \$250 Thrivent generosity grants were written and received. John Berg, Norma Messman & Peggy Preston wrote grants and formed teams to purchase and deliver needed items for the victims of the fires. The response to the needs of those affected by the fires was great. Everyone contacted was willing to join the effort and helped meet the needs.

Advent Midweek Ecumenical Worship Wednesdays December 2, 9, 16 at 7 pm

We will be celebrating Advent with St Albans and First Christian. Each congregation will be hosting a virtual service (ours will be on December 2nd) at 7:00 PM. This gives us an opportunity to see how different congregations worship and to celebrate Advent.

Advent Sunday Evening Worship 5:00 p.m. at the Faith Lutheran Parking Lot November 29th, December 6th, 13th and 20th

We are going to have a series of worship services in the parking lot of Faith Lutheran Church. There will be candles, a tree and an advent wreath blazing as a reminder that Christ is the light that pierces our darkness.

These services will center around the gospel lessons of the four Sundays: Jesus saying what the end will look like in the temple, the proclamations of John the Baptist (one Sunday from Mark's gospel, another from John's gospel) and Mary hearing the annunciation. We are going to have a mix of traditional hymns (like O Come O Come Emmanuel and The Angel Gabriel from Heaven Came) with classic rock anthems (such as Bad Moon on the Rise by Creedence Clearwater Revival or Bob Dylan's Times They are A Changin').

After the service itself if the weather is nice we will have a fire going in a fire pit. You are invited – if it is nice – to bring a hot chocolate or tea or some other warm beverage and to have socially distanced time with your sisters and brothers in Christ.

Advent is also the time we will begin a new church year in the gospel of Mark. Mark is sometimes described as a war time gospel, a gospel where from the very start Jesus goes to battle with the forces of sin, death and darkness. Christ's light will shine through the gloom of night, reminding us that God is always with us, that God with us is the base reality of our life.


