Sisters and brothers in Christ,

I'm generally not a fan of Christmas movies. The Hallmark Channel and it's ilk are too schmaltzy, too contrived (this is just my preference, if you like them, enjoy them). While the cartoons are more too my taste (especially the deep bass of narrator in the Grinch), if I am being honest, I watch them because Vanessa loves, not because I do.

There is one exception: It's a Wonderful Life. My family would watch it every year on Christmas Eve while baking cookies. When I served as a pastor near Pittsburgh, a movie theater in the city did a fundraiser for the food bank every year: see the movie for free as long as you bring food (or donate) to the foodbank. That movie has been a part of my December traditions in many ways and places, it is one that Vanessa and I always watch together (usually the evening after putting up our Christmas tree).

In a lot of ways it is an odd Christmas movie. After all, the main character, George Bailey, goes to such a dark place that he contemplates suicide, wonders if things would have been better off if he never was. Jimmy Stewart, suffering from PTSD after his time with bomber crews in World War II, acts tremendously – and also bares his soul and his suffering on the screen.

And yet, I think one of the reasons I love It's a Wonderful Life so much is that it is the most real movie to Christmas itself. After all Christmas, the first Christmas was a dark holiday. The emperor, the Caesar Augustus, who minted coins claiming divinity, called for a census so that he could squeeze every denarius, every penny that he could out of his empire. Mary and Joseph had to travel while Mary was pregnant and imminently due, so far from home that she had to give birth in an unfamiliar location. And the petty tyrant who was a client king in Palestine, feeling threatened by an infant instituted a slaughter, sending the holy family fleeing to Egypt for refuge.

At it's heart Christmas is a dark holiday. It is a holiday where a people in captivity and bondage long for freedom. It is a holiday where we hear a quote from Jeremiah about loud lamentation (Matthew 2:18), where a people long for God's light.

I think that is the Christmas I need this year. As we are in another partial shutdown, while Vanessa and I continue to encounter family only over phones or screens, while we worry about family and friends who are of vulnerable health, I am reminded more than ever how much I need God's light shining with me. I am reminded that I need Jesus to break into my darkness. I am reminded that I need Jesus to show me how we are all a family together, how the Spirit can unite our community (Faith Lutheran Church) by the power of the Holy Spirit. The babe of Bethlehem has claimed me, and has claimed you, as his own and nothing can change that fundamental reality.

## Advent Midweek Ecumenical Worship Wednesdays December 2, 9, 16 at 7 pm

We will be celebrating Advent with St Albans and First Christian. Each congregation will be hosting a virtual service (Pastor Mark presiding on December 2<sup>nd</sup>) at 7:00 PM. This gives us an opportunity to see how different congregations worship and to celebrate Advent.

## Advent Sunday Evening Worship 5:00 pm Drive up Worship

November 29<sup>th</sup>, December 6<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>

Pastor Mark has worked with Cheryl Blum for a mix of both traditional Advent songs and non traditional reminders of Jesus being born among us.

Every Sunday night in Advent we will have drive up evening worship at the church. We will have lights and candles for the parking lot to make the evenings a bit more festive. We plan to lean in to Jesus shining into our darkness during Advent.

### **Christmas Eve Worship Service**

5:00 pm drive up worship 7:00 pm Facebook live stream

On December 24<sup>th</sup> we will have two, mostly identical services. The first these will be at the church parking lot where you. can drive up (bringing your own communion) and tune in to 102.1 FM on your car radio. The second of these will be livestreamed from the church.

Remember that the most beloved of Christmas Carols, Silent Night, was first sung accompanied only by guitar in 1818, because flooding had damaged the church organ.
