Brothers and Sisters,

Lent is the perfect season for this time. It is a season of repentance and reflection. It begins with Jesus in the wilderness confronting the devil. This year we will follow that in the gospel of Mark. Mark has been described as a wartime gospel, where all the forces of sin, death and darkness, from the Roman Emperor, to the devil, to demons, scribes, illness, hunger, want and everything else are confronted by Jesus.

It is appropriate, as we continue in this time of pandemic where we are at war with the virus that we are in Lent with Mark's gospel. In this time, we are reminded that we are not alone in this, that we have Jesus right here beside us, journeying through this time of wilderness, doubt and struggle. He is with us and we are never alone.

This Lent, I hope that you can find meaning. For my devotionals I have been reading a new translation of the Old Testament by Robert Alter. I've appreciated different words on the same story: God's passion for the world and all its people. The words, slightly different from the NRSV (the version we use in worship), help me to hear it again.

That's some of my spiritual journey. Find a way in this time, to see meaning. It could be through reading a gospel, or beginning a prayer journal or taking on a Lenten discipline, or watching the Chosen (a series with a different take on Jesus), or by praying for those on our

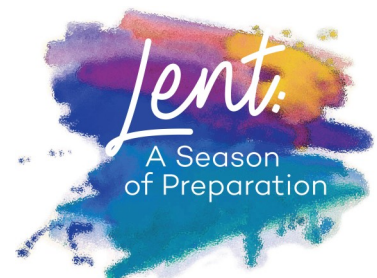

Candlemas History



Groundhog Day is February 2nd. This holiday isn't just about shadows and winter weather predictions, as most of us believe. This observance, also known as Candlemas goes way back in history to biblical times.

The Law of Moses stated that parents were obligated to bring their first born son to the church and make an offering to God on his behalf. This took place (usually) after the baby was 40 days old. This is based on the biblical teaching that Mary also presented Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem following his 40-day period of purification after he was born. So, Jesus was born on December 25, add 40 days and you get February 2nd!

When Jesus was presented, an old, devout Jew named Simon, held the baby in his arms and said that He would be, "A light to lighten the Gentiles." (Luke 2:32) This is how February 2nd became known as Candlemas (or Candelaria); and, since the 11th Century with the blessing of candles.

It is also called the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, in the Eastern church. But, it's called the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Western church. No matter what it's called, the celebrations both have the same format and are significant for the blessing of candles and candlelight processions.

There are those, however, who feel that forming a procession with candles really originates back to the Romans who had a custom of going around the city in February with a candle procession. So the candle procession wasn't created by Christians, however when the Christians attempted to Christianize the Romans, they borrowed this custom of using candles in religious services. So, in 494 C.E. Pope Gelasius I created the Feast of the Purification of the Virgin Mary. Ironically, it was also used to kindle a "brand" left over from the Yule log at Christmas.



Groundhog Day

Groundhog Day (Pennsylvania German) is a popular North American tradition observed in the United States and Canada on February 2. It derives from the Pennsylvania Dutch superstition that if groundhog emerging from its burrow on this day sees its shadow due to clear weather, it will retreat to its den and winter will persist for six more weeks; but if it does not see its shadow because of cloudiness, spring will arrive early.

The weather lore was brought from German-speaking areas where the badger (German: *Dachs*) is the forecasting animal. This appears to be an enhanced version of the lore that clear weather on the Christian festival of Candlemas forebodes a prolonged winter.

9 months without campers and guests due to COVID-19 which allowed us to complete the dining hall and other important site upgrades such as the A-Frame bathrooms, firebreaks and the new bridge.

8 unique ecosystems make camp a destination for outdoor education and allow for strong partnerships with Outdoor School providers all over Oregon. We are hoping for ODS groups to return in spring 2021.

7 fir trees were trimmed as part of our Healthy Forest Plan which is a multi-year effort to help strengthen the forests and streams at camp in partnership with Natural Resources Conservation Service and the Long Tom Watershed Council.

6 garage-style doors that open up to bring the outdoors into our new dining hall building.

5 volunteers who come each week to help with site projects; we are so grateful for their dedication.

4 feet wider is the new bridge than the old one which was in great need of replacement. We are grateful for this new safe bridge to carry cars and trucks across the creek.

3 young adult interns! Charlie, Amber and Allie are wonderful assets to the camp staff and bring unique experiences and perspectives to Camp Lutherwood! We continue to partner with The M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust for the Vision and Call internship program.

2 private wine-tasting dinners sold at the Spirit of Harvest event which, along with other auction items and donations, raised over \$170,000 to support the ministry of camp in 2021.

1 group of amazing, faithful supporters (including YOU!) who have kept camp in your prayers and who have generously ensured camp will be up and running through this next year. Thank you!!

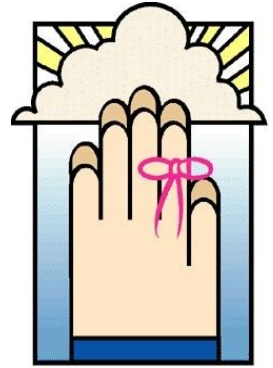
