Multi Church Book Study: Ecumenical Book Study Addresses Racism

Wednesdays at 6:30 starting on July 7th at Albany Methodist Church (outside) Zoom

Are you interested in learning more about racism and working toward God's realm of equality and justice? Join an in-person or online study of Robin DiAngelo's book *White Fragility: Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk about Racism*. We will start on July 7th and meet each Wednesday for seven weeks through August 18th. If you are interested, please purchase the book.

The online study will be from 11:00 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. and will meet via Zoom. The in-person study will be from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. outdoors in the courtyard of Albany First United Methodist Church, 1115 28th Ave. SW. You must be fully vaccinated to attend the in-person book study.

Before the first class, buy *White Fragility* and read the Foreword, Author's Note, Introduction, and chapter 1. Leaders for both the online and in-person studies are Father Bob from St. Alban's Episcopal Church, Pastor Mark from Faith Lutheran Church, and Pastor Lura from Albany First United Methodist Church.

For the evening study at Albany First United Methodist Church please go to 1115 28th Ave SW at 6:30. Bring a chair if you are able, be prepared to sit apart socially distanced and wearing a mask (these are the rules of our sister congregation). Also you might note that their rules are different than ours (vaccinated and unvaccinated are welcome at our activities, we just follow OHA guidelines regarding masks etc.) Since they are hosting, they make their own policy.

Bible Study

Bible Study via Zoom at 1 PM Monday's June 21, and 28, July 12, 19 and 26

We are going to be studying the gospel of Mark on Mondays at 1. We are going to be diving in to the first written of all the gospels, the earliest record we have of the life of Jesus. Since we are in the second year of the lectionary cycle, we are also going to be studying the primary gospel for our worship as well. The group has been meeting over Zoom over the course of the pandemic and will at least start that way (some of the folks who have been joining us are friends who live a long ways away). Look for the email with a link in it.



Small Groups Meetings





Groups must abide by the building use policy. Key parts of this policy are keeping an attendance record (in case of need for contact tracing), making sure people abide by Faith Lutheran's mask policy (which is also an article in this newsletter) and making sure the area used is left cleaner than it was found

For established groups such as the Scouts, quilters or string therapy, speak to the group leader about restarting. For a different group that wants to use the facility, please co-ordinate with Nancy George in the church office.

Mask Policy

Oregon has changed their mask guidance and we are updating our policy to go along with it. All along the council has abided by the guidelines. Accordingly starting this Sunday <u>if you show</u> <u>proof of vaccination to ushers as you are checked in, you may be unmasked in Faith Lutheran Church.</u>

Proof vaccination is a vaccination card showing that you are two weeks out from your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna or two weeks out from your single dose of Johnson & Johnson. This follows state guidelines, which you can find here (page 3 applies to faith communities): https://sharedsystems.dhsoha.state.or.us/ DHSForms/Served/le3727.pdf

<u>You only have to show proof of vaccination if you wish to be unmasked</u>. You can of course continue to enter while masked without showing vaccination proof. Some of us, like Pastor Mark, may continue to be masked because they have unvaccinated family members at home, others may continue to mask out of caution, still others may not be able or desire to be vaccinated. It is important to continue to respect others - if you are vaccinated and someone else is wearing a mask, give that person social distance.
