Sisters and brothers in Christ,

I feel like I am walking a precipice between sorrow and hope. Regathering in the sanctuary for the joy of the resurrection was a joy. Seeing familiar faces in a familiar setting brought smiles to the eyes, where we could see them despite masks. Vaccines bring a hope of finally turning the corner against this disease. Children going back to school mean that the youngest among us are getting the contact and socialization that they need.

At the same time we are all aware that pandemic numbers are growing in Oregon - rising to points last seen in the winter. Many of us know someone who has suffered from COVID 19. All of us have been affected in some way. We are still in the place where we have to be vigilant. We are back together but not yet back to the way things were before. For me it feels like walking a narrow path between promise and despair. The hardest part of the last year + is the uncertainty of what the future will bring.

A connection point might be the theology of the Apostle Paul. His theology is sometimes called the theology of Already but Not Yet or the Overlap of the Ages. Paul describes Jesus as the hinge point of history, he speaks of God's incarnation as the point that creation and all the cosmos turns on, the cross and the resurrection representing a new dawning together. Paul tells us that God's kingdom is already here - that Jesus has come. At the same time it is not yet fully realized, the world has not been brought into conformity with new life in

Church Council Happenings

This is a review of the church council meeting on 4/21. There were a few items that we wanted to make sure to bring the congregation up to speed on.

- 1) Our church has been running a deficit in 2021 (and ran a deficit in 2020 as well). We had some significant unanticipated expenses thus far 2021: tree trimming/limb removal from the ice storm and replacing the parsonage furnace being chief among them. Lower giving in addition means that Faith Lutheran has a deficit of over \$13,000. The council discusses our finances every month, are aware of the situation and are concerned.
- 2) The PPP loan that was taken in 2020 was forgiven in April of 2021, and converted to a grant. The purpose of this program was to guarantee payroll for employees, which Faith Lutheran did during a very uncertain time. That forgiveness gives the congregation more of a financial cushion. At the same time, the council continues to be faithful and cautious stewards of the congregation's resources. We give a big thank you to Janice Virnig, our treasurer, for her hard work all the way through the process. The Executive Committee recently learned that the deadline to apply for PPP round two has moved up to April 30th, and will be discussing that application this week. In light of our current deficit, it appears necessary to apply.
- 3) We discussed worship inside the sanctuary and affirmed that we would be following OHA guidelines. The council decided to keep worshipping indoors, despite the higher county metrics because of the importance of worship. The council also spoke about potentially moving outdoors for worship on non rainy Sundays beginning on the 30th of May. Look for another article about May worship in the newsletter.
- 4) On 4/9 Linn County returned to high risk, on 4/23 Linn County reached all the metrics except one (statewide hospitalization number) for extreme risk, a situation the council (and all of you) keeps an eye on as we try to faithfully care for each other and find ways to gather safely.
- 5) We discussed small groups such as the quilters, bible studies, the string therapy group and Scouts meeting at Faith Lutheran Church. We did not reach a consensus, in part because of the rising rate of infection countywide. We will decide, at our next meeting, at what risk levels the building will be available for small groups.
- 6) Our next meeting is on 5/12. If you have any questions or concerns to bring to the council, please feel free to talk to Charles Bonville, Kim Sass, Nancy George, John Berg, Janice Virnig, Jon Aaberg, Dick Olsen, Andie Daniels, Gordy Gamet, Peggy Preston, Terry Virnig or Pastor Mark Bringman. Or let us know and we would be glad to have you join us at our next meeting over Zoom at 7pm on 5/12.

Office Hours Changing for May & June Monday, Wednesday and Friday 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM

Dear FLC Congregation,

We are writing to let you know that tonight (Monday, April 26) your FLC Council met, discussed and unanimously approved an application process for the Federal Government's *Paycheck Protection Program* (PPP), Round Two, to assist us financially during this turbulent time.



The rules of Round Two state that a business or non-profit must experience one quarter in 2020 in which gross receipts (donations and rental income) were down by 25% or more. In the third quarter of 2020, our receipts were down by 26% as compared to the same quarter in 2019.

The Council gave consideration to the fact that our first application in PPP Round One <u>was approved for forgiveness and converted into a grant</u>. Those funds will be recognized as income for our church as of April 2021.

The Council also contemplated whether or not this issue needed to go before you, the congregation, for a vote. The relevant portion of the FLC Constitution, C12.05 c., states that the council may "enter into contracts of up to five per cent of the budget for items not included in the budget."

As we read the intent of C12.05 c., it is that council may only spend up to five per cent of budget on some **new** expense, or **new** spending, that was not part of our annual budget. However, all of the payroll positions are budgeted items and we are pursuing an alternative manner of funding/income for a portion of that payroll. The PPP program request is limited to 2.5 months of 2020 payroll.

We have had an email discussion about the timing of when we could announce a special congregational meeting, and then conduct that meeting two weeks thereafter. We wanted to make it a more open process, recognizing that a few in our midst expressed the feeling that FLC should not have applied for Round One.

But before we could act on such a meeting, the Council was informed that our deadline to apply is April 30, and that Key Bank had set this earlier deadline in order to ensure that they could process all Round Two applications prior to the federal program deadline of May 31.

The Council also gave consideration to the fact that the original deadline for Round Two was March 31. However, Congress acted to extend the deadline by two months because of the billions of dollars that were still available. The Council recalls that one of the arguments put forth in opposition to applying for Round One is the mistaken impression that we were causing other businesses to go without. On the contrary, both Rounds One and Two had an excess of funds available.

Finally, the Council recognizes its role as the Board of Trustees / Directors to manage FLC business and

fiscal affairs, to conduct financial affairs efficiently and to be responsible stewards of its investments. We take our role seriously and understand this to include pursuing forgivable loans, or grants, that increase our financial resources, and will take steps to ensure that FLC remains as a viable resource not only for you, our congregation, but also for the organizations that operate within our buildings for the good of the whole community.

I hope this letter finds you at peace with the unanimous Council decision to apply for PPP Round Two. We offer our highest praise to treasurer Janice Virnig for working with the bank to successfully apply for Round One and her further efforts to guide us for Round Two. She has spent countless hours on these endeavors and her work has become a blessing for our church. If you have a chance, do let Janice know how much you appreciate her work.



We will receive guidance from the Oregon Health Authority in April that will specify the operational guidelines for overnight youth camps.




