Dear Beloved of God at Faith in Albany,

The red hearts, chocolates, and conversation candies have been out for a while, already! Valentine's Day. Hmmmm. The card companies come up with all kinds of "holidays" or remembrances to get you to buy cards, candy, trinkets and send them to someone you love.

There are other things to focus on in February. It is officially Black History month, Go Red for Women heart disease awareness, Teen Dating Violence month, and Racial Equality month. These have become officially recognized needed awareness.

Black History month is a rich time of remembrance and celebration. Our siblings with beautiful darker skin tones continue to experience discrimination at the least, and violence at the worst. They have endured a history of slavery that did not defeat them.

Often we experience something invented or developed by our Black siblings, like:

- Potato chips were created by George Crum in 1853.
- Light bulb carbon filaments were added by Lewis Latimer to Edison's invention, to make the bulbs last longer.
- Open-heart surgery was first performed by Dr Daniel Hale Williams in 1893.
- Blood bank was invented by Dr Charles Drew, a surgeon, researcher and inventor. He figured out how to safely bank blood for surgical use, and also discovered that blood plasma is universal and usable.
- Mathematician Katherine Johnson mapped the NASA flight of Alan Shepard, and other space exploration.
- Alice Parker designed a natural gas furnace that was more efficient than fireplaces.
- With over 200 patents, Marian Croak invented improvements for online voice and data systems, paving the way for videoconferencing, and her technology allowed donations by text after Hurricane Katrina in 2005.

The list is extensive, the contributions of our Black siblings, to life as we know it today. These are things that we can celebrate together.

Racial Equality is also important. When we read the Bible we discover a God who loves diversity, justice and equality. Yet we humans have a long history of "othering" those who don't look or act like us. There is no reason that is faithful to the God we know and believe. There are so many words to us about how to treat our neighbors within the Scriptures we hold dear.

Probably the best is the Acts 2 story of Pentecost Day when the Spirit of God came to Jerusalem and blew about, firing up the disciples and the hearers that day. The hearers were from all over the known world, and hearing about God's mighty work of salvation in their own languages, in the nuances of their cultures.

Dr Luke Powery, professor at Duke Divinity School says it so beautifully, "We are only unified if we are diversified." Here's the deal: we need each other because God's Spirit has breathed into all of us, called us beloved, without discrimination. The Spirit goes where the Spirit wills. There are no distinctions, no requirements. The Spirit of Pentecost breathes and speaks in the language that we can hear and understand.

As people who have experienced privilege, as followers of Jesus, we are called to speak for inclusion, diversity, compassion, and belonging for all of God's children in this country. You can call it the Civil Rights Movement, or the Kingdom of God. The Spirit is calling us to work for justice. Any challenges or threats to the beautiful gift of God's Kingdom of diversity and unity must be confronted. It is the Spirit's work in us.
