# **FAITH at WORK**

#### **May 2025**

Dear Beloved of God,

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen indeed! Alleluia!

Easter Sunday was a spectacular day, with two baptisms and family. What a beautiful day to celebrate God's faithfulness in Christ Jesus.

At the font, God's "YES" to those two, and to us at our baptism, is all about what God has done and is doing and will do in us and for us. If we are willing. If we believe God's love is able to bring new life from death.

During the Easter season we hear of the resurrection sightings recounted for us. Jesus did not stand around. He met people where they were—in grief, in fear, in confusion, in hope, in joy. And he continues to come to us in our life, unexpectedly, inviting us to continue to follow him.

Follow Jesus. You see, the resurrected Jesus doesn't stand around. He is on the move. He meets Mary in her grief. Peter has moments with him. The disciples and followers encounter the risen Lord Jesus. Even Saul, who becomes Paul, meets the Lord. Before his ascension, Jesus shows up all over. And in the gospels Jesus tells his followers to wait for the Holy Spirit to come upon them. When that happens on Pentecost, they don't stand still either. The Spirit keeps them moving—out into the world they go!

At baptism we gain our true identity, children of God. Our place is in Christ Jesus, in God's Kingdom, not in a geographical place. While we are in the world, we are God's and learning to love the world the way God loves. All in!

God's story that we tell in Scripture is about a relationship that is alive, dynamic. Abraham and Sarah leave their home and go out into the world. After 430+ years in Egypt, where God had provided, the Israelites were liberated and traveled in the wilderness for 40 years before entering the Land of Promise. When Jesus sends out his followers they go all over, with some staying in Jerusalem. Paul was the most prolific, traveling all over the Roman Empire with the good news of Jesus Christ, God's love in the flesh.

The church where I grew up, Hope Lutheran, is also declining, and has an Interim Pastor to help them figure things out. The thought of my home church closing, changing, is hard. I know the thought of closing Faith is hard—you have told me this. But is that what God is calling us to do? Maybe, maybe not. We will see as we participate in the process we are beginning. We have seven members willing to lead and facilitate the Listening Season we are entering into with Good Shepherd. You are all on the Prayer Team, praying daily and listening to God speak. The Holy Spirit is inviting us to participate in this time of listening and discovery.

This will be a time of taking steps of faith in the Crucified and Risen Jesus Christ. There will be some letting go. We cannot continue forward with the Spirit and the process without trusting that God's got us. Something new is being planted and incubated, which will spring to life.

Remembering our baptism, God's "YES" to us, and God's faithfulness throughout the generations, in all places, we can go out, we can let go, we can trust that God's got this and us.

Resurrection is powerful! No matter what happens, we always have Easter. That is our identity.

We are continuing our process with Good Sheperd, they are doing the discernment work we did last year with Pastor Dorthy. We should begin our combined work with our internal and external listening teams in June. Update 4/29/25 – I received an updated time line at a meeting with the Pastors and James Howard, President of GSLC last night. I will have Carol add it to the newsletter and we will also mail out a hard copy to make sure everyone receives one. This is a fluid process and things are changing as we move along and I wanted to keep you all updated as best I can. Please let me know if you have questions.

Work on our Centennial celebration in August is continuing. Jan Wetzel, Nancy George and Linda Gail are working on setting it all up. It will be a 2-day celebration and the proceeds from the rummage sale are going towards the event.

Council meetings will now be held the 2nd Tuesday of the month at Noon in the conference room. You are always welcome to join us. Bring your lunch!

### MAY-AUGUST 2025 (Phase 2) Discernment

- May 18, 2025: Listening Team Training After Worship
- TBD Before June 8: Listening Teams meet and make a plan
- June 8, 2025: Commitment Service with both Congregations
- June 8, 2025: Joint Congregational Meeting #1 After worship, the teams share timeline and set-up listening schedule with groups. Listening begins during this meeting with groups one-on-one, two-on-two, then four-on-four.
- Blending process for Worship to include members of both congregations to plan worship monthly.
- Listening teams do the listening
- Listening teams gather data & prepare to share what they heard with the congregations.
- Create a list of SMART goals to present to the congregations based on the listening.
- August 20, 2025: Listening Data Collected and forwarded to Oregon Synod.
- August 31, 2025: Joint Congregational Meeting #2 Listening teams present what they have been hearing, and share vision for mission and ministry with SMART goals. Congregations then prepare for a vote whether they will move on to the next Phase which will be the transition phase.

#### SEPTEMBER-NOVEMBER 2025 (Phase 3) Prep for Commitment and Transition

- September 1, 2025: Establish a transition team: (Explore and make a plan for the blending of leadership, new identity, inventory of physical assets and plan for blending fiscal assets) Plan a Transition Retreat for the team.)
- September (TBD) Transition Team Retreat: This retreat will be to outline the goals and benchmarks for the transition team.
- September 28, 2025: Joint Congregational Meeting #4 Synod will report back the analyzed results of the listening.
- **November (TBD): Joint Congregational Meeting #4:** Transition team reports to the congregations their plan for blending and finalize SMART goals for the Transition Year.

#### DECEMBER 2025-JANUARY 2026: Official Votes

Both congregations decide whether they want to legally blend for mission and take an official vote.
 Prepare to extend a new call to Pastor Cindy for the blended congregation including negotiation of new compensation package.

# JANUARY 2026-TBD (Phase 4) Transition Year

- The blended congregation will use this year to establish policies, begin to blend mission and ministries and evaluate the SMART goals established during the process of discernment.
- Begin with a transition team and blended council retreat to establish timelines and guidelines for the blending ministry.

\*\* Please check expiration date markings - FISH cannot accept foods past their marked expiration dates.


